Authority - Take the Limits Off!

syio and blessings to all our partners, friends and readers of this periodical in the Matchless Name of our Risen Lord Jesus! We have good news to report to you about the move of our Creator on the First Nations Reservations of this Country. For some of our new readers and as a reminder to others I want to first share a report we printed last fall. It is from the book "One Church Many Tribes" by Rev. Richard Twiss (Rosebud Lakota/Sioux).



- 1. Pre-Columbus Indian population estimates range from 10 to 12 million (conservative).
- 2. By 1900, only 237,000 Native people were left!
- 3. In the early 1800's, California was home to an estimated 260,000 Indians. By 1900, there were 20.000.
- 4. Today we have close to two million self-declared Native Americans in the USA and another 1.3 million living in Canada.
- 5. About 200 tribes have become extinct.
- 6. The Federal government recognizes 300 reservations (less than 4% of the continental USA.) Nearly one-half of reservation populations are non-Indian.

Even though leaders of many tribal nations have declared themselves Christian nations; only three to five percent of the two million self-declared Indians call themselves born again Christians!

For over 500 years traditional methods of evangelism have only worked on the same three to five percent of the people - until this generation - praise God! More Native pastors and leaders are preaching the "Jesus Way" of evangelism. Their message is simple, that Jesus loves you just as you are. He does not require a change of culture before you can receive His blessings of eternal life. He wants a relationship with you; all that requires is a change of your heart and by faith, the receiving of Christ's forgiveness and the work of His Holy Spirit. The Good News is that you can receive this eternal life of blessings right now! (John 10:10) You do not have to wait till you cross over.

One such message came last month from Native Pastors Ellson and Debra Bennett (Navajo) at an awesome camp meeting and motorcycle rally in San Carlos Apache Reservation, Arizona. "A Time for Restitution for the Reservation" was Pastor Ellson's message to the Apache Nation. Webster's dictionary defines "restitution" as "an act of restoring or a condition of being restored; a restoration of something to its rightful owner". The method of restitution

came from Acts 3:19 Amp: "So repent (change your mind and purpose); turn around and return to God, that your sins may be erased (blotted out, wiped clean), that times of refreshing (of **recovering from the effects of heat**, of reviving with fresh air) may come from the presence of the Lord;" (emphasis mine).

Pastor Ellson was given a word from the Lord about "taking the limits off". Psalms 78:41 says "Yes, again and again they tempted God, And limited the Holy One of Israel." The point here is "they" limited God; God did not hold back on them. This message is not just for the Apache Nation, but for the Body of Christ. We serve a big God and we know He is capable of all things; let us not be the ones to get in His way!

This ties to the directive I received from Adonoi over two years ago when He told me to "Teach my people to redefine reality." How do you redefine reality? You must "Have an open mind, with a view to change." Romans 12:2 tells us we must change the way we think, then we can know what the Will of God is for our lives.

Most of us have been blessed with wonderful preachers and teachers of the Word. However, the best teacher anyone (especially ministers) can have is the Holy Spirit!

Ask yourself: are you still tormented with addiction struggles, financial or health pains? Do you have a relationship problem or work related issues that keep you up at night (even those of you in ministry)? Let me encourage you to spend time reading your Bible in private and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal all Truths. John 14:26 tells us that is His job, don't limit Him. If the Bible says it - you'd better believe it! Let Him redefine your reality. Remember - more than likely - it is you that will need to change, not God and not those that come against you.

Here is the good news: Once you yield and obey the voice of the Lord by making these changes, you will be free, but someone else will be free too. Who? Jesus! He will be free to operate in your life to bring you blessings that you never dreamed of before! (Deut 28:1-13) That is what I call Good

A story of obedience and divine appointments!

Before my trip to the Healing of the Nations Rally and Camp Meeting last month, I received a prophecy by Sister Olga Villalba, an intercessor from Coppell, Texas. The word was that I would find a "Saul/Paul" as in Acts 9:10-17. He would not be part of the main camp. She went on to describe the "camp" site and where he would be hiding. He would be listening to the speakers and music but didn't want anyone know he was there, but I would go after him and bring him in.

By the second night of the camp meeting I had almost forgotten about this word. The time in worship, the testimonies of healings that happened during that day, the Word that was preached – served to bless me; I was totally caught up in the love of God. At one point during this time the speaker, Pastor Kelvin Box, noticed a young man outside the camp and invited him to join us. After some coaching, those of us on the back row welcomed him and we had him sit with us. He stayed for a short time then left. He told me his name was Roger (not his real name). It wasn't long before I forgot about him, again, into the activities.

Then just before midnight and well after the altar call, there was a Holy Ghost tug to get up. I walked out of the camp and down the dark hill; I looked around and waited a short time before heading back when I saw Roger coming from behind a trailer. When I called his name he started to run — I asked him to stop and promised I wouldn't hurt him. (like a 5'4" woman could hurt a guy that big). He walked to me. I asked him if he knew Jesus. He just shook his head no. I asked if he wanted to know Jesus. This time he shook his head violently. No! I then began to minister the love of Jesus to this young man. He put his hands on his head and began to make unpleasant sounds - Selah.

The last question hit home. I asked him "do you want want to be free from the terrible pain you are feeling," with tears in his eyes he nodded yes. I told him to take my hand and I would introduce him to my Jesus. My Jesus would set him free and he would never feel pain like that again. He took my hand, it felt like what the old-time Pentecostals called "Holy Ghost glue" wherever we were going – we were going together. We walked back into the camp and down to the platform. The anointing on this young man got stronger and stronger the closer we walked toward Pastors Kelvin and Ellson. My

lightening fast brain finally kicked in and I realized this was Saul! The anointing was so strong it became hard to walk. To me it was as if total silence fell on the camp as people watched and prayed. Another man then came up for his salvation too! Roger received Jesus that night, the story of his deliverance is too detailed for the short space I have here but he also received a transformation. One minute he was so "out of it" from sniffing glue, etc.. that he couldn't say his name - to totally sober the next! The foul smell went away too!

This picture was taken shortly afterwards. He told me he was only 15! I had a chance to give him a CMA "Hope for the Highway" Bible. He will always remember the night of his salvation was when the motorcycles came to the Apache Nation. The motorcycles came to the Apache Nation thanks to Pastors Ellson and Debra Bennett and their obedience.
